All investments we make in the club are focused on us achieving our agreed strategic imperatives and initiatives:

Initiative 1: Improve the financial performance of the club.

Initiative 2: Improve Member club house facilities.

Initiative 3: Improve operational performance of club and Bowls.

Initiative 4: Improve governance and compliance.

During the year we have implemented a number of initiatives including:

- We welcomed our new Secretary and Chief Executive Mark Slattery who started with us on the 28th November. Mark has worked tirelessly since he started and is setting the foundations for the future success of the club.
- We commissioned the services of Hospitality Management Australia (HLA) to undertake an operational review of the club. In doing so our club auditors reported that they no longer see the need for a governance and procedural audit, as they suggested in 2015, as we have adopted a number of new initiatives that have improved our club's operations.
- We made improvements to our Property, Plant and Equipment totalling \$188,081
- We have implemented a new "chart of accounts" for the club's financials and contracted with a new account management reporting service to provide HBC with a greater level of management and financial accounting reporting.
- Made changes to the gaming area including modifications to the layout of the gaming room, the addition of ducted air-conditioning and heat extraction system and the introduction of six (6) new machines.
- Upgraded the bar area adding in new glass chillier and glass racks.
- Upgraded the club's computer systems to improve the club's security, processes and productivity of both our information systems and connectivity.
- The Board commissioned GroupN Architects to prepare design concepts, costing's and staging plans for the future development of the club.
- We have established two club committees to assist the board to: 1. Develop the traditional and social game of bowls and 2. To review the structure and requirements of a new club constitution.

I would like to thank my fellow Board members for their ongoing drive and commitment to make our club a friendly and successful local community-bowling club. Also, a big thank you to our CEO Mark Slattery and all his team for all the important work they do and their commitment to providing the level of service they do to our members and guests.

As club President I have been pretty busy watching our ladies play in finals, which is great.

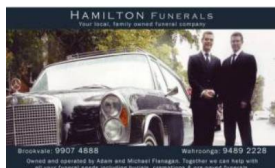

- Building a new club website that will enable members to renew memberships and book functions online.
- Start to promote barefoot bowls better by holding barefoot bowls open days. There are already 2 planned, 25 March and 22 April 2018. These days will include live music and different food options with food trucks already booked in.
- There will be focus on building the clubs function business. As part of this club, it has been reviewing food options and developing catering packages with different suppliers so we can meet the needs of any of our members.
- A re-focus on the clubs community sponsored clubs and improved engagement with all stakeholders.
- Continuous and ongoing improvements to the clubs gaming operations. Planned upgrades include changes to the entrance for improved privacy and additional new and upgraded machines.
- Whilst on gaming, recent upgrades have included a new plant wall for the outdoor room, new screens in most of our older machines and upgraded note acceptors to most of our older machines. This last upgrade now means that the new \$5 and \$10 notes are now accepted in all but 2 of our gaming machines.
- Looking at options to open a coffee shop at least for all large events that the club holds. It is hoped that at some stage we can make a coffee shop a more permanent feature of the clubs operations.

This year will be the year that the club focuses on marketing and events. The objective is to review existing events and big days currently held at the club and look for opportunities to expand the number of events and big days we have. Some of the days and events that have been scheduled for a revamp include:

- ANZAC Day
- Pennant Finals weekend
- Melbourne Cup
- Children’s Christmas Party
- New Year’s Eve

We want to make these days bigger and better and the planning to achieve this outcome has already started.

To make all of this happen the club has employed Freshwater local, Mish Miller as our Functions and Marketing Coordinator. Mish brings with here extensive marketing and events experience and understands how to put an event together and get people here. I welcome Mish to the team and look forward to her helping us drive the clubs functions and event business.

If you're a fairly competitive swimmer, it's an opportunity to get a national Top 10 ranking in an event that you have not raced in this year. For others, it's often a pleasant surprise to find out that you DO have a Top 10 ranking in Masters Swimming. Gloria is the numbers whiz at this. She will be at squads on Sunday's to discuss and take entries. She has already researched which event you have not swum and are most likely to Top 10 in, or, you can do your own research by checking out the Top 10 rankings in your age group, nationally or at state level. Checking out how other swimmers in your age group are going can help you set goals and keep you motivated.

Swimming Uphill

Abel, Mary, Sonja and Dawn have entered the Hills postal swim. This swim focuses on endurance: it's not a race. Known as the "uphill" swim, entrants swim 2 x 400m, 2 x 800 m 1 x 1000m and 1 x1500m. All these swims need to be done between September 1 and November30, 2017. You need to get someone to time keep your swims, which are eligible for state and national Top 10 times.

Ocean Swim Season

The many ocean swims that characterise our summer have commenced. Check out the web sites, ask some club members if they are interested to go with you, and for sure, you will bump into other Master swimmers at the beach. Not used to the surf? The Toowoona Bay swim is regarded as gentle and good for newbie's. It's on November 25, and has 400 m, 1 km and 2 km events for adults, as well as a junior ocean swim.

Optus Swim Sydney Harbour, 20th January 2018

Early bird entries are now available. Distances are 2 km (\$40), 750(\$30) and, for the kids, \$300m (\$10). This is a new date and sponsor for the event. They say: "We've jam packed the day with fun and entertainment, heaps of action in and out of the water."
